



is available 24/7, and can be reached by phone call, text or email. As of March 31 we have responded to 92 calls and assisted 112 disabled individuals and their families. We provided referrals to local community resources for food

and water; health, safety and hygiene; replacement of medication, durable medical equipment, and consumable supplies; temporary housing and transitional home modifications.
